Mayor, CPA & Attorney) endorsed A-1880 (voter approval of bond debt), which was sponsored by Assemblyman Doherty. Tom will fight hard to put an end to the increased bonded indebtedness (67.8 million to 89 million--an increase of 21.2 million from 2000 to 2005). The Freeholders continue to bond against their reserves and pay for bond counsel (more money for the county attorney Guy DeSapio, who reviews the work of the bond counsel).</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>County Debt</u></p> <p>Mayor Walton of Hampton fought against A-1880, which was sponsored by Assemblyman Doherty (now State Senator), and threatened to obtain a preliminary injunction to block the bill in committee with the blessing of current Freeholders. The current Freeholders and municipalities continue to bond without voter approval, which Mayor Walton supports.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>County Legal Expenses</u></p> <p>Hire two full time-salaried county attorneys and a paralegal for \$300,000 instead of contracting out work to the current county attorney Guy DeSapio (who has a part-time assistant county attorney making \$48,181) for an outrageous sum of \$845,286.86 in legal fees & \$62,380.00 county salary, which includes pension and health benefits from the county in 2008—see website http://www.njiat.com/ and click the “Local Government” tab on top to see the 1099 & Salary on PDF.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>County Legal Expenses</u></p> <p>Would continue to renew county contract for the current county attorney Guy DeSapio.
